Performing & Visual Arts Scholarships

The Loreto College Past Pupils' Association is generously funding three Performing and Visual Arts Scholarships for Year 8 students in 2019.

These three \$1,000 scholarships are offered for 2019, and are to be used for tuition, master classes or a special program that will support the development of skill in the specific strand of the Performing or Visual Arts.

Open to any Year 8 Loreto College Ballarat student, these Past Pupils' Association Scholarships are designed to provide support in the development of skill in any branch of the Performing and Visual Arts (eg Art, Media, Dance, Drama, Music or Speech Art). The scholarship may be applied to the payment of tuition fees, purchase of instruments, music, equipment or attendance at workshops, camps, performances, concerts etc. It is expected that the recipients will share their gift in visual and performing arts within the school community.

\$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to three successful applicants. A formal application process will involve written application followed by an audition (for performing Arts) or written application accompanied by a folio and an interview (for Visual Arts).

The final decision of an offer of a scholarship rests with the Principal.

Please complete the application form, with appropriate supporting documentation and materials (eg. Art folio) and return it to the Principal's Office (marked for the attention of Ms Judith Potter) by Friday 26 April, 2019.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Submit a folio which shows evidence in a variety of techniques and materials. Students need to demonstrate drawing from observation and select from any of the 3 subject selections (eg still life, landscape or a portrait), 8 to 10 pieces. This can be done using any medium (eg 2D or 3D). All work should be recent, (eg. not from past years in primary school or Y7). ◆ Participate in an interview to discuss this work (5 minutes)
