

## **Term 2 - Onsite Guidelines Yr 10 students studying a Unit 1 subject**

In accordance with the guidelines provided by the Premier of Victoria, Loreto College will have all VCE and VCAL students returning to school - learning on site from Tuesday 26 May. This means that some year 10 students studying a Unit 1 will be required to attend school to join their class. This may be for part of the day or the whole day, given Yr 10 students will continue with remote learning for other subjects.

### **Students Onsite**

For students attending Loreto College during Term 2 the following guidelines must be followed:

In order to prevent the spread of the virus, as far as is reasonably practicable, movement around the campus will be strictly limited and a significant increase in hygiene practices will be necessary.

- Open hours
  - drop off 8:30am (no earlier) – can be later if full day supervision not required
  - Pick up no later than 4:00 pm– students may leave earlier with written permission
- Yr 10 Students are required to wear their school winter uniform during this period of onsite supervision
- Students are to go to the canteen though the back door (lake side)
- A staff member will be there to greet the students on arrival
- Students will be directed to hand wash/sanitise
- Students will need to walk through sliding doors into the Mulhall Centre
- Students will find a place to work for the day, maintaining the requisite distancing (1.5m) from others
- Students are asked only to bring what they need for the day, for example:
  - Books
  - Laptops
  - Headphones
  - Food and water (the canteen will not be open; toaster and microwaves will not be available)
  - Personal medications
- Usual scheduled breaktimes will be followed throughout the day (recess at 10:45am, lunch at 12:50pm). Areas that can be accessed are the Mulhall centre and the quadrangle.
- During this period, students will need to take everything home with them at the end of the day as access to lockers will not be available
- Students must sign out with the supervising teacher.

If a student is unwell and unable to attend, where they would have been in this situation, parents are asked to call the school and inform staff of their daughter's absence.
